How could a prophecy that predicts one's Christian martyrdom serve as an encouragement to Peter?

Jesus commanded His followers to be faithful evangelists (Matthew 4:19-20), disciplers (Col. 1:28; Matt. 28:18-19; John 21:15-17), and to suffer "for a little while" for His Name sake (1 Peter 2:19-21; 5:8-11; 2 Tim. 3:12; Acts 14:21-21).

Why did Jesus highlight the cost of discipleship so often in His teaching ministry? Find six such passages in the four Gospels this week. Find three related verses in the New Testament?

Memorize 2 Timothy 1:7; 3:12 and 1 Peter 2:21. Re-read 2 Tim. 2:1-12, Phil. 1:21, and Revelation 2:8-11.

Review the 5 vitally important lessons from the past few expositions of John 21 (*see next page*). Which was the most beneficial to you? Which was the most convicting? Why/How so?

Lord Jesus, this I pray: "To see Thee more clearly, follow Thee more nearly, and to love Thee more dearly, day by day." How does carefully studying the Gospel of John help us do just that?
